Leadership and governance

Expected standard 

Leaders are highly reflective and dedicated to ensuring the club provides the best possible care for children. They explain how they work to create a fun, welcoming environment where children enjoy attending. Leaders describe how they offer a wide range of experiences, including sports activities, a variety of arts and crafts, and quiet spaces for those children that need it. They demonstrate how activities and resources are adapted to meet the needs and interests of different age groups, particularly when younger children are present. Leaders describe the clear emphasis they place on promoting children's health and wellbeing. They ensure children benefit from fresh air daily and access to nutritious snacks. Leaders explain how they have recently updated the menu to integrate further well-balanced options. Staff have followed this through with children and further adaptations are planned as a result of their feedback.

Leaders describe how they establish clear expectations that help children feel secure and behave positively. They discuss how this approach supports children to understand processes and routines, such as registering, organising their belongings and preparing for the session. Leaders explain how they regularly evaluate the provision to make improvements. The recent enhancement of routines has had a positive impact on children's understanding of what is happening next. This is particularly beneficial for new children settling into the setting. Leaders have established robust policies and procedures, and ensure that staff understand their roles and responsibilities in safeguarding children. Staff describe how they receive regular supervision and support, and their wellbeing is given high priority. They have opportunities for further professional development to enhance their skills and knowledge. Leaders discuss how they have excellent relationships with leaders and specialists at the host school. This ensures they can plan and implement high quality and effective support for all children. In addition, close and collaborative partnership working with parents, helps to ensure that all children's individual needs are understood and effectively met.
